# CREDITS NEEDED TO GRADUATE

ENGLISH	4 credits
MATHEMATICS	4 credits
SCIENCE	3 credits
HISTORY	3 credits
HEALTH	.5 credit
PHYSICAL EDUCATION	.5 credit
FINE ARTS	1 credit
PERSONAL FINANCE	.5 credit
COMPUTERS	.5 credit
ELECTIVES	4 credits

# CREDIT INFORMATION



## PHYSICAL EDUCATION

If you complete 2 seasons of a school sport, 2 years of band, OR 2 years of ROTC, you do not need to take Physical Education. You DO, however, need to make up that half credit with another class.



## EXTRA COURSES

If you complete more than that required number of courses in a certain category, they will count towards your elective credits. For example, if you take Computer Skills and then 3-D Printing, the .5 credit for 3-D Printing will go towards your electives since you already earned the required .5 computer credit with Computer Skills.



## JVS

If you plan to attend JVS after your 9th grade year, we highly encourage you to have completed your PE and Health requirements.


# USE YOUR TRANSCRIPT AND CREDIT WORKSHEET!

The bottom right hand corner of your transcript tracks how many credits you have earned so far in each area. Remember, it will not yet have given you credit for courses you are **currently** taking.



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# SCHEDULING FAQs

# Q: HOW DO I REQUEST A STUDY HALL?

A: When you make your course requests next week in PowerSchool, there will be an option for you to request a study hall for one or both semesters. Remember that you do not earn credit for study hall.

# Q: WHAT ABOUT LUNCH?


A: You do not request lunch. Every student will automatically have a lunch on their schedule. If you do not wish to have a lunch, your parent/guardian must contact your School Counselor approving you to not have a lunch.

# Q: HOW DO I GET EARLY RELEASE OR LATE ARRIVAL?

A: Rising 11th and 12th graders may request ER/LA just like they request any other class. Remember this is only a request and it will be reviewed for approval towards the end of the school year.

# Q: HOW DO I MAKE MY GPA HIGHER?

A: Getting better grades! The semester grades you earn in your classes are what determines your GPA. For all regular classes (not Honors, AP, or CCP), an A counts as 4, a B counts as 3, a C counts as 2, and a D counts as 1. The more higher grades you earn, the more your GPA raises and vice versa.





## CREDIT TRACKING WORKSHEET

## 2024-2025 SCHEDULE CHANGES
