Graduation Requirements

Students must meet <u>all</u> graduation requirements in order to participate in graduation and receive their diploma.

Three components to graduation requirements:

- 1. **Credits** earn a minimum of 21 credits in required & elective courses.
- 2. **Competency** score of 684 or better on Algebra I & ELA II state tests
- 3. **Readiness** earn at least two diploma seals (one must be a state seal)

- Career Readiness
 - o Earn 12 points in approved industry credentials, proficient scores on Webxams, Ohio Means Jobs seal, WorkKeys test

 - Earn a B or better in a CCP course in the subject area in which student has not met competency
- Military Enlistment
 - Student must show proof of military enlistment
- ACT / SAT Scores
 - o ACT English 22 or higher, Math 22 or higher
 - o SAT Reading & Writing 480 or higher, Math 530 or higher

Course Requests / Timeline

Students use the online "Class Registrations" feature in PowerSchool to request their high school courses.

- February 5th Parent Meeting
 - Program of Studies available to view on EHS website.
- Tuesday, February 13th Request Screens Open
 - Course request screens open
- Tuesday, February 13th 8th grade scheduling @ Northwood
- Thursday, February 15th 8th grade scheduling @ Westwood
- Wednesday, February 21st 8th grade scheduling @ Eastern Heights
- Friday, March 8th Request Screens Close
 - Request screens close at the end of the day.
 - At that point, requests are locked and not able to be changed by parents or students.



2024 - 2025 Program of Studies

The <u>Program of Studies</u> contains all of the potential course offerings for next school year. For each course, students can review information such as:

- Course name
- Course description
- Length of the course
- Credit type
- If the credit is weighted or unweighted
- Course fee
- Notes on possible connections to seals and/or state tested courses

The Program of Studies also contains information related to:

- Graduation requirements
- Honors diplomas
- Athletic eligibility
- Criteria for seals

School / Course Fees

- Courses may have fees (as indicated in the Program of Studies).
- Fees are used to purchase specific items for the course that are considered consumable, items that students may keep when the course is completed, or other supplies related to the course.
- All fees must be paid in order to purchase Prom tickets, receive the diploma at graduation, and to release official transcripts.
- Fees may also be added to student accounts for supplies and equipment that are lost, damaged, or not returned to the school such as Chromebooks, chargers, textbooks, uniforms, calculators, etc.
- Fees are assigned a few weeks into each semester and at the end of the year. Fees notices are emailed multiple times per school year.

Athletic Eligibility

Per Ohio High School Athletic Association rules:

- Student athletes <u>must carry at least 5 academic courses</u> (not including PE) throughout the year to maintain eligibility.
- Student athletes <u>must be passing at least 5 classes each quarter</u> (not including PE).
- Physical Education courses do not count toward athletic eligibility.
- Credits recovered in summer school do not count toward athletic eligibility.
- Eligibility is determined by the grades from the quarter preceding the season of the sport.
 - Example-fall sports eligibility is determined by spring 4th quarter grades.



Special Education and 504 Services

 Middle school and high school Special Education Departments and Intervention Specialists work together to schedule to students who receive co-taught and resource room services.

• EHS offers a comprehensive spectrum of services for students who receive services through IEPs and 504 plans.



Advanced Course Options-Honors, AP, and CCP

Elyria High School offers multiple options for advanced coursework. There are advantages and disadvantages depending on individual student characteristics, goals, and needs. Students are encouraged to talk with their current teachers and their parent/guardian about the best course options.

Honors Courses

Honors courses are aligned with Ohio state standards, generally require more reading and writing, and more homework outside of class time than the general college prep curriculum. Honors courses offer a deeper examination and critical analysis of the topics covered in the course. Summer reading is required for Honors ELA courses. The grades for Honors courses are weighted.

Advanced Placement Courses

AP courses involve college level coursework with more extensive reading, writing, lab activities, homework, and critical thinking and analysis of the topics covered in the course. While the AP courses do cover material related to Ohio standards, they incorporate specific content standards and curriculum as determined by the College Board. Students in AP courses are expected to take the AP exam in their specific course at the end of the school year. Students may earn college credit based on their AP exam score. Grades in AP courses are weighted.

College Credit Plus

College Credit Plus courses are college courses. Students earn both high school and college credit. Students may take CCP courses on-site at EHS or in person or online at LCCC. Courses are run exactly the same as the college course and tuition and books are covered by the district. Families do have to repay the cost of the course and materials if the student fails the course. Course grades are on the permanent college record. Students must meet intent and application deadlines. Please see your school counselor for details.

JROTC - Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps

- No obligation to join the military
- Focus on leadership characteristics and development
- Participate in many community and school activities
- Military Seal with 2 successful years of JROTC (no enlistment)
- PE waiver with 2 successful years of JROTC
- If you are thinking about the military after high school:
 - 3 years of JROTC means a higher rank when starting in the military
 - Higher percentage of ROTC college scholarships are from JROTC units
 - A means to earning nominations to the three military academies–West Point, Navy, &
 Air Force
- 9th graders take ROTC I course

World Language – French and Spanish

- Students begin with French I or Spanish I
- EHS offers four years of each language with CCP options available.
- Students with a passion for World Language may earn the Seal of Biliteracy
- Students learn about other cultures and customs
- Colleges and universities like to see 2 years of a World Language

- If you are looking to fill an elective credit, consider signing up for French I!
- In French class, we listen to French music, read and write stories, watch French movies, and try some French food.
- French class is a great way to learn about a different culture and an introductory level of the language.

Schedule Change Guidelines

Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year:

Student schedules are released in August. Schedule changes are considered for the following reasons only:

- A course is no longer being offered.
- A student took a course over the summer and does not need it on their schedule.
- A student has a course on their schedule for which they have already earned credit.
- Academic misplacement
 - A student is scheduled for a course in which they do no meet the requirements, such as a CCP course.
- A class is missing from the schedule.

Dropping Courses:

- Students are expected to remain in full year courses for the full year. School policy dictates that students dropping full year courses, drop the course with an F.



^{*}These guidelines apply to both first and second semester schedules and course changes.

Things to remember...

- Requests are for courses, not specific class periods.
- Requests are requests, not guarantees.
- 9th graders must schedule at least 6 academic courses throughout the year.
- Students need to request Study Hall if they want Study Hall.
- Students do not need to request lunch. We will schedule every student a lunch period.
- Students in Band, Choir, and Orchestra
 - In the request screens, you will see coursed named "Band", "Choir", and "Orchestra".
 - Select each option that pertains to you; this will indicate your intent to participate in those courses.
 - The directors in each program will place students into the specific band, choir, and orchestra sections based on auditions and other criteria as indicated in the Program of Studies.
 - The directors will communicate those decisions to students in the spring.

Things to remember...


- Students <u>cannot</u> request CCP courses in the online request system. See your counselor to request a CCP course. Communicate your intent to take CCP courses by March 8th. (CCP Intent forms are due by March 22).
- Students <u>can</u> request Honors and AP courses in the online request system.
- Review the prerequisites for each course.
 - Talk to your current teachers about the courses that are the best fit for you!
- Colleges and universities like to see a variety of coursework, 2 years of a World Language, and a relatively full course load through the Senior year.
- Consider connections between coursework and seals.


